pensive, rolling their languid eyes, and displaying a lack of enthusiasm by nibbling their toast and cooling their tea with sighs. Choice B is incorrect because it does not directly support the claim of disinterest and detachment. Choice C is incorrect because it describes a humorous incident with a fly in the milk-pot, but it does not directly support the claim of disinterest and detachment. Choice D is incorrect because it mentions taking snuffers and a large cauliflower in each candle, but it does not directly support the claim of disinterest and detachment.

11. B: Choice B is the best answer because it most logically completes the text's discussion of the argument that the correlation between exposure to violent media and an increase in aggressive behavior doesn't necessarily imply causation. The argument suggests that individuals predisposed to aggression may be more inclined to consume violent media content, creating a correlation without establishing a direct cause-and-effect relationship. Because "Sarah Chang" is essential information identifying the "technologist," no punctuation is necessary. Choice A is incorrect because no punctuation is needed. The convention being tested is pronoun-antecedent agreement. The plural pronoun "They" agrees in number with the plural antecedent "electricians." Choice B is incorrect because the use of "their" creates a possessive pronoun but does not serve as the correct subject for the sentence. Choice C is incorrect because the singular pronoun "he" does not accurately represent the group of professionals, as it may exclude female electricians and does not align with inclusive language. Choice D is incorrect because the singular pronoun "It" doesn't agree in number with the plural antecedent "electricians."
